For the current quarter, the Group registered revenue of RM10.7 million and loss before taxation of RM1.3 million as compared to revenue of RM9.7 million and loss before taxation of RM3.6 million for the preceding year corresponding quarter. The reduction in loss before taxation for the current quarter was mainly attributable to higher average selling prices for the Group's brick products. The higher loss before taxation for the preceding year corresponding quarter was also due to the write off and an impairment provision for property, plant and equipment totaling to RM1.7 million.

For the current 12-month year to date, the Group registered revenue of RM39.8 million and loss before taxation of RM5.5 million as compared to RM38.7 million and RM7.9 million respectively for the preceding year corresponding year to date. Excluding the effects from the insurance claim received of RM1.5 million and the write off of inventories and property, plant and equipment totaling RM1.2 million as well as the impairment loss of property, plant and equipment of RM1.3 million, the loss before taxation for the preceding year corresponding year to date would be RM6.9 million. The reduction in loss before taxation for the current year to date was mainly attributable to the increase in revenue as a result of higher average selling prices amid a slight drop in sales volume for the Group's brick products.

The Group recorded a lower loss before taxation of RM1.3 million for the current quarter as compared to RM1.7 million for the immediate preceding quarter. The reduction in loss before taxation was primarily due to higher revenue and improve margin as a result of better sales volume and average selling prices for the majority of the Group's brick products.

B3 Commentary on Prospects

Amid the slowing growth of the Malaysian economy, and with no significant imminent recovery in sight in the real property sector, construction activities in the sector are unlikely to pick up momentum, and the demand for clay bricks will likely continue to stay soft. With the overall over capacity in the industry, competition will remain stiff and selling prices will continue to be under pressure.

Given the aforementioned scenario, the Group will continue to focus on its strategy and effort to contain the production costs, optimise its operational efficiency and product quality in order to stay competitive in the industry, and will strive its best to achieve a satisfactory financial results for the financial year ending 31 December 2019.
